## Cherishing all God's Creatures

The abundance and diversity of fruits, vegetables, flowers and fauna causes me to pause and gaze at God's creativity. On our family farm, native trees and plants provide safe habitat for wildlife. Farming within this ecosystem is a core stewardship value. As naturalists, we respect the marginal wetlands in order to protect the Tuscarora Mountain water flowing toward the Chesapeake Bay. When I moved from my home in Guatemala to my PA birthplace in 2003, I began identifying the animals, birds, insects, and reptiles around me. This practice has helped me to value each one of them for their created purpose and not be fearful. As a follower of Jesus, I attempt to love my neighbor as myself (Luke 10:27). Part of loving my neighbor means taking care of my environment. In caring for God's creation, I am a good neighbor to those downstream from us. Who lives downstream? Why is this connection of major importance? It might be a stretch in answering these questions but the migrating Bobolink travels from Guatemala to nest in our farm's meadow. Central American friends tell us that our grasslands are vital for their existence. Another connection is my vocation as a cross-cultural worker. Recently, I was honored for 13 years of service as medical interpreter for Keystone Health farm migrant workers which ensures our food's security. Attentive listening has been my companion. Friendship fosters understanding as we all care for our world. Our perspective grows as we work within these relationships. God's love and kindness opens the door to friendship no matter our ethnicity. September is especially busy as farm workers harvest bountiful crops. There is a sense of urgency to get the crop picked. In this hurried pace, there is a necessity to pause, take a deep breath to enjoy the marvels of an evening sunset while the chorus of birds and insects sing. We are called to "...stop and consider the wonders of God" (Job 37: 14, NLT). As we balance our lives between the activity and the pause, my prayer is that we learn to know our neighbors and their stories. In this way of loving one another, our communities will thrive as unfailing love, truth, right living and peace come to live in one space. The Psalmist writes, "Unfailing love and truth have met together. Righteousness and peace have kissed! Truth springs up from the earth, and righteousness smiles down from heaven. Yes, the LORD pours down his blessings. Our land will yield its bountiful harvest. Righteousness goes as a herald before him, preparing the way for his steps". (Psalm 85: 10-13, NLT). Even in these days, when summer turns to fall, when students go back to school and our schedules change amid life's transitions, God promises to go with us no matter where the journey leads us.

**PEGGY JACKSON TO SPEAK AT CHAMBERS POINTE: "THE KIDNAPPING OF PEGGY ANN BRADNICK"**

Peggy Jackson will be with us on **Thursday, September 7** at 1:30 PM in the Chambers Pointe Chapel to give a presentation about her harrowing ordeal. The kidnapping of Peggy Jackson took place near Shade Gap, Pennsylvania on May 11, 1966. Bradnick, who was 17 years old at the time, was kidnapped by William Diller Hollenbaugh, sometimes referred to as "Bicycle Pete" or "the Mountain Man" and held captive for seven days before she was rescued by Pennsylvania State Police and the FBI at a farm in Burnt Cabins, Pennsylvania. Her ordeal made national headlines, and the search was the largest manhunt in United States history at the time.

## TOURING HERSHEY THEATER

A group of Menno Haven residents boarded the bus at 9:00 for an amazing tour of the restored Hershey Theater. Our very personable guide did a great job showing us all the remarkable details of the theatre. Because of the 1930 depression, Mr. Hershey provided for over 600 workers who would have otherwise been unemployed, to build the theatre, Community Building, and Hotel. The theatre opened in 1933. By the end of the 20th century the theatre needed a thorough cleaning and refurbishing. Smoking had been permitted in the lobbies and marred the beautiful designs throughout the building.



The artistry in both the lobby and the foyer before entering the theatre itself is a "must see". When one enters the theater we forgot to look up and marvel the workmanship. The M.S. Hershey Foundation provided 3 million dollars over a 3-year period to restore the theatre and in 2000 the restoration began - everything from the front lobby to backstage. A most unusual feature is the 6 ton fire curtain, which has a watercolor painting of the Grand Canal in Venice on its cover that is pulled up above the stage during performances. My personal excitement was to once again see the moving clouds and shining stars in the "sky" that I saw back with Jim in 1947. The stars are still shining!

**Menus online:** Rather than pick up a paper copy of weekly menus, go to the Menno Haven web site ([mennohaven.org](http://mennohaven.org)), click on the "Resident Portal" icon, enter the password (don't know it – contact Jeremy Fry), click on "Menus," and then the desired venue. Scroll down and click on "Full Menu," select the date of interest and the menu will appear. To download the menu to your computer, scroll down to "Download Menu," and click on that. This can be printed out on the back of some scratch paper, or, just put it on the desktop for quick reference.

**Don't recycle!:** Recycling is good, but not having something to recycle is better. Rather than purchase a bottle of water and then recycle the plastic container, purchase a reusable drink container (for example, a bicycle water bottle) and fill that with tap water. This saves energy and money. When shopping (grocery, department stores, etc.), bring your own tote bag. Reusable tote bags are available at many stores and are given away at senior fairs, etc.
