Getting Reacquainted with Chaplain Adam

Like Chaplain Steve, I was born on a snowy January night, right here in Chambersburg. I attended Marion Elementary School, Chambersburg Area Middle School (Gary & Gloria Crum were my music teachers), Chambersburg Area Senior High School (Pat Gutshall was my English teacher and Bob Thomas was my health/physical education teacher) and Shippensburg University (Dr. Harper taught one of my courses).



I served in the United States Army Reserve with the 316th Station Hospital in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. My military occupation specialty (MOS) was 91J, better known as a physical therapy specialist. Though I enjoyed working with patients, I was beginning to feel the call to ministry.

My call to ministry was affirmed shortly after I married Stacy Stewart in 1990. Shortly after the birth of our first son, Mark, Stacy and I felt the Lord leading me to attend seminary. Four years later I had completed my studies and Stacy and I added another son, Andrew, to our family. As a minister I have enjoyed the privilege of serving as the pastor of several churches, a hospice chaplain, and now as a chaplain at Menno Haven. Menno Haven held a special place in my heart long before I joined the team. I began pastoral visits here in 1996 and was always impressed with care provided by the various staff members and residents.

My mother-in-law, Phyllis Stewart, was resident of Chambers Pointe until her death in 2009. Many of you may remember my Father, Gene Leeper, who lived in Chambers Pointe until his death in 2016. My uncle, Bill Leeper, still lives in the Renaissance and my aunt, Thelma Stewart, lives in the Village. What a privilege it is to serve in a community with so many wonderful people. I'm reminded of the Apostle Paul's admonition:

BEAT THE HEAT: HYDRATION TIPS

Staying hydrated, especially by drinking water, is an important part of a healthy lifestyle.

Why is hydration important?

- Helps to maintain normal body temperature
- Carries nutrients throughout the body
- Lubricates joints
- Carries away and aids in removal of waste products

Signs of Inadequate Hydration:

- Dry cracked lips
- Poor skin turgor
- Sunken eyes
- Tiredness
- Change in mental status
- Constipation
- Fever

If dehydration occurs, it can result in:

- Confusion
- Urinary tract infections
- Respiratory infections
- Constipation
- Renal Failure

7 Opportunities to stay hydrated during the day:

- Meals
- When taking medications
- Activities
- Therapy
- Bedtime snack
- Between meals
- During exercise

How much do I need? The basic rule of hydration is to drink when you are thirsty, but as our bodies age, our thirst sensation decreases. Fluid intake recommendations are individualized based on age, weight, body type, and medical condition; however, the recommended minimum fluid intake per day is 1500ml (6.25 cups). Please consult with your physician or registered dietitian for specific fluid intake recommendations. (**All beverage options count towards this daily goal, but make sure you are choosing healthier options, such as water and milk. Watery foods and things that melt at room temperature, like ice cream and popsicles, also count towards this daily fluid goal**). If you are an active individual or older adult, it is recommended that you drink more water. Remember to drink more on hot/humid days and when exercising!
