COME FLY AWAY WITH ME



On Saturday, June 16, a group of 13 Menno Haven residents visited The Dulles National Air and Space Museum. We were lucky to have as our guide Charles "Chuck" Aston who resides in Brookview. He volunteers at the museum as a tour guide and is very knowledgeable about the aircraft. The Museum serves as a satellite location to display a variety of aircraft and spacecraft that can not be displayed in the Air and Space Museum in Washington DC. The hangar is 10 stories high and many of the smaller aircraft were hanging from the ceiling. The larger aircraft were displayed on the ground floor. As Chuck introduced us to the different exhibits we were able to see the evolution of the planes (from biplanes to the Concorde) including the materials used in construction and the development of technology.

We spent a lot of time learning about the Boeing B-29, Enola Gay, the aircraft that dropped the atomic bomb over Hiroshima, Japan in 1945. Captain Tibbits, the pilot, recommended that several changes be added to, and removed from, the plane so it would be safe in his delivery of the bomb. We also were introduced to many of the bombers the US used during WWII, and there were several German bombers on display also. There was a section of planes that were used during the Vietnam War, and another area of interest was a fairly large section of helicopters that Chuck described to us. He also gave us some wonderful information about the space craft Discovery. All in all it was a very interesting and informative afternoon that also helped to revive memories for many.

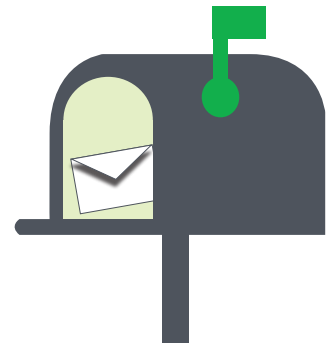
FROM THE FAMILY OF JIM HEISTAND

Recycling tip: A trip to the store usually results in a collection of plastic bags along with the merchandise. The best option to reduce the amount of plastic is to bring your own reusable bags. Grocery stores sell reusable bags, so purchasing a few will save lots of plastic. If you do end up with plastic bags, return them to a store that collects them (all grocery stores do this); do not put them in the recycle at Menno Haven. If you purchase only one or two items, then refuse a bag and carry out the merchandise with the sales slip visible.
